## Assemblies

This week in assemblies we focussed on the **British Value of Individual Liberty**. We started by sharing some new school rules. We learned that individual liberty does not mean you are free to do what you want, you are free to do what is right. Children listened to the story "The Hueys in The New Jumper" and looked at how we all have the right be an individual.
