Clinically vulnerable (cont`d) Physical contact and activities

Advice should be sought from Occupational Health where necessary.

Children: Pupils in "Clinically Extremely Vulnerable" category have been identified and may be continuing with remote education.

Pupils classed as "Clinically Vulnerable" can attend school following an individual risk assessment carried out in consultation with the child's parents. Pupils should be kept in consistent groups or bubbles

General: Staff communicate to children regarding social distancing / personal hygiene etc.

Key issues include:

Anyone displaying any symptoms of coronavirus are not permitted on the premises.

Social distancing of 2m is applied throughout the school where possible.

Minimising contact, touching and mixing by altering, as much as possible, the environment (such as classroom layout) and timetables

Cleaning hands more often than usual - before & after PE and before and after eating, sneezing, coughing - washing hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and water and or use of alcohol hand rub or sanitiser.

Ensuring good respiratory hygiene - promote the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.

There will be no sharing or drinks or water bottles.

Staff with Mild Asthma - COVID19.

All members of the AN PESS team will continue to monitor the hazards mentioned in this section and will be alert to ensuring the appropriate control measures are followed.

No use of shared indoor gymnastics equipment and this will remain out of action until further notice. This includes all fixed and wall / apparatus.

Schools and school staff to ensure and monitor washing of hands before and after PE lessons (particularly if any limited equipment has been used)

Schools to ensure adequate provision of and easy access to hand sanitizer dispensers, soap & water.

Personal challenges and some aspects of Physical Activity using a student's own body weight could be another form of suitable activity depending on the size of the class.

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			Outdoor activities should be prioritised where possible, and large indoor spaces used where it is not, maximising natural ventilation flows (through opening windows and doors or using air conditioning systems wherever possible) distancing between pupils and paying scrupulous attention to cleaning and hygiene. This includes the following activity areas: dance, games, athletics, outdoor and adventurous activities and swimming. Class changeover/break times are staggered to reduce the level of circulation throughout school. (One-way circulation routes considered, or place a divider down the middle of the corridor if the width allows).

Halls, dining areas and internal and external sports facilities are used at half capacity for lunch/sporting activities and wiping of any used surfaces is a reasonable approach.

- Attending school with PE kit on will limit the need to use changing rooms.
- Schools should ensure sufficient standard cleaning equipment is available in all areas.
- Social distancing measures still apply and zoning or cone marking out areas which cannot be used will help manage the area effectively.

Arrangements in place to ensure toilets do not become crowded-limiting the number of staff, children or young people who use the toilet facilities at any one time. Practical lessons can go ahead if equipment can be cleaned thoroughly and the classroom/ other learning environment is occupied by the same children or group in one day, or properly cleaned between cohort groups. afPE's position at the current time is that school fixtures should be avoided

Staff breaks are staggered to avoid congestion in staff rooms. This includes the AN PESS team being able to access toilet facilities during a suitably quiet period.

N.B. The AN PESS team will not be responsible for supporting any changing or supported changing of children during this pandemic. Staff will ensure they are always at a social distance from anyone changing. This will be the individual school's responsibility

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When reviewing areas/spaces Μ consider:

Widening routes where possible. Removing unnecessary obstacles.

Signing and communications:

- markings/signage at entrances.
- movement of intersections.
- encouraging people to wait and allow others to pass.
- -one-way movement.
- -separate entry and exit routes.
- -enlarge access and exits.

Schools should have queuing system process in place for entry to facilities, hand washing before & after P E etc

There will be a limit to extra curricular clubs offered by the AN team to schools during this period. Any clubs available must be closely regulated by the school in terms of groupings and bubbles. There will be no mixed group clubs at this time to avoid spreading or contracting the virus through further interactions. AN PESS team to enter buildings. sign-in and move to teaching space. AN PESS team should limit visits to staff-rooms in host schools to reduce risk of transmission (advisory)
