Place value within 100 Addition and subtraction within 100 Multiplication and division</p>	<p>Science As scientists we will learn to... explore how the shapes of objects can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. In doing this they raise questions, perform simple tests, and gather and record data.</p>	<p>RE As thinkers we will learn ... to recognise that the concepts of God, Incarnation, Gospel, and Salvation are all part of the big story of the Bible. They will find out about the key events of Holy Week and Easter, making links with the Christian belief of salvation. Pupils will learn about how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus being their saviour within celebrations and worship in church at Easter.</p>

Children will use a globe or atlas to identify where Kenya is. Children will compare Kenya to local area by comparing weather, culture, animals and, landscapes.</p>
<p>Art & DT As artists we will learn to... expressive paint by using paint in an intuitive and exploratory way. Children will explore the brush work of different artists. Children will then use this to draw from a colourful still.</p>	<p>Music As musicians we will learn ... Inventing a musical story Music is used for many reasons and can help us to tell a story and express our feelings. Music can be loud or soft, fast or slow, smooth and connected, or short and detached. We can also use instruments with different sounds to help communicate a story and different emotions.</p>	<p>PSHE As citizens we will learn... Citizenship. Children will understand rules and the purpose of these rules. Children will look at their similarities and differences between themselves and their peers. Children will understand that they belong to different groups and can identify some groups they belong to.</p>	<p>Computing As programmers we will learn to... Use technology to take photos.
