Identify local common flowers within the school grounds. Grow and look after seedlings. Investigate which conditions seeds need to germinate.</p>	<p>RE As thinkers we will learn ...</p> <p>about the concept of 'Gospel' and the good news of forgiveness, peace and love that Christians believe Jesus brings. Pupils will learn about Matthew the Tax Collector and how Christians believe that Jesus offers forgiveness, looking at their heart rather than what they have done in the past. Pupils will learn about the instructions that Jesus gives in the Bible and how Christians follow his example and these instructions in order to behave in a Christ like way. Pupils will take time to consider whether Jesus' good news is only good news for Christians or whether there are things for people from different worldviews to consider.</p>

Identify the key people involved in the Battle of Hastings and why the battle took place. Look at why there was a battle for the throne and how life changed after the battle. We will look at the historical evidence available and compare this to other history events.</p>
